

# Quick Guide to meet general requirements

## Foundations of Knowledge and Learning Curriculum (FKL)

- 3 credits of Fine Arts (visual arts, music, dance, theatre, and creative writing)

Human and Cultural Diversity in a Global Context (Interrelations among global economic, political, environ & social systems & create an awareness problems confronting nations)

- 6 credits of Social and Behavioral Sciences (study social groups, institutions, and organizations, and their context and study of human behavior) Note some majors may require EGN 3615. IT students have required classes.

Also, 3 credit hours of the above coursework must be completed Human Historical Context and Process (HHCP). The courses noted with an asterisk (\*) will meet both HHCP and the FKL area listed.

Note: First Year Students admitted fall 2015 or later must meet the State General Education (SGE) by taking one St. GenEd Social Sciences (SGES) and one St. GenEd Humanities (SGEH) that meets SGE requirements.
